DISCLOSURE OF CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS: Pursuant to Government Code section 84308, members of the Board of Supervisors are disqualified and not able to participate in any agenda item involving contracts (other than competitively bid, labor, personal employment contracts, contracts valued under fifty thousand dollars, contracts where no party received financial compensation, or contracts between two or more agencies), franchises, discretionary land use permits and other entitlements if the Board member received more than \$500 in campaign contributions, within the preceding 12 months, from the applicant or contractor, an agent of the applicant or contractor, or any financially interested participant who actively supports or opposes the County's decision on the agenda item. Members of the Board of Supervisors who have received, and applicants, contractors, or their agents who have made, campaign contributions totaling more than \$500 to a Board member within the preceding 12 months, are required to disclose that fact for the official record of the subject proceeding. Disclosures must include the amount of the campaign contribution and identify the recipient Board member and may be made either in writing to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors prior to the

subject hearing or by verbal disclosure at the time of the hearing.
